Evaluation, comments, recommendations of the thesis advisor:

Markus Formel's thesis presents a compelling and thought-provoking argument that contributes significantly to the theoretical debate on the principle of Responsibility to Protect (R2P) in International Relations. His main idea and theoretical argument are well-formulated and thoroughly developed throughout the paper, demonstrating a deep understanding of the subject matter and his great ability to articulate complex ideas. His contribution to the theoretical debate is, for me, the greatest contribution of this thesis. The student has effectively synthesized a range of existing research and theoretical frameworks to present a novel and original perspective that expands the concept of R2P by bringing it to the economic realm. His argument that bad economic policies causes equaly severe human suffering as serious international crimes is convincing, especially by looking at the case of Venezuela.

Nevertheless, I would like to draw attention to some areas that could have been improved in his work. Firstly, the methodological aspect could have been more clearly articulated and more rigorously implemented. By applying more methodological rigorousness in terms of data selection he could have improved the validity and reliability of his findings. Secondly, the formatting and style of the thesis could have been more consistent and polished (e.g. aligning margins). Overall, I believe the thesis is a good piece of academic writing that demonstrates, most of all, a high level of critical thinking and engagement with the subject matter.
