Evaluation, comments, recommendations of the thesis advisor:

The author of the thesis has successfully proven their hypothesis while maintaining a neutral stance and objectivity. This is a difficult task, given that the main subject is the Israeli regional security.

Although the thesis was limited by space, the author wisely focused on the military sector and managed to incorporate relevant literature and interviews with academics and practitioners in the field. The topic is highly relevant for the understanding the ever-changing nature of Middle East politics. Open resources, such as newspaper articles and scientific studies, have been assessed and integrated correctly into an overall framework by the author.

The clarity and coherence of the thesis argument and structure is commendable as the author has organized their ideas in a logical and persuasive manner making it easy to follow the line of reasoning throughout the thesis. The thesis title, while more of a metaphor, still accurately matches its content.
